JOHN DACK SUTER (1921-25)

He died after a short illness last September, just before his 91st birthday. After Colet Court he entered Colet House when Cecil Smith was house master, and played in the school's 3rd XI cricket and 3rd XV rugby teams.

During the war he served in the RAF, leaving in 1946 with the rank of flight lieutenant and spent most of his life working in the family department store business. He was chairman of the Slough and Uxbridge based company for six years.

A dedicated member of the Uxbridge Rotary club for many years, he was its president in 1948. In 1989 he received the Paul Harris award – the highest honour of the Rotary organisation – and was active chiefly in fund-raising and old peoples' support activities.

A passionate player and follower of sport, his family was the most important element in his life. Married for 57 years, until his wife's death in 1990, he leaves a daughter, three sons, nine grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.
