New law could mean an upswing in lettings THE FUTURE for the The new law, which comes into force early next year, will introduce a new

type of letting called the Assured Shorthold Tenancy, which Frank Farr say will "benefit greatly"

people wishing to buy an investment property.

There will be a minimum period of six months for each letting - under the present Protected Shorthold Tenancies it is one year and it will not be possible to have a "fair rent" registered on this type of letting, as it will be let at market rent.

The agency says: "For the owner occupier or person with a present investment property, the thought of a tenant registering a fair rent is always most worrying.

"Once the Bill has become law, a tenant will no longer be able to apply for a fair rent, only for a market rent. This, of course, does not apply to any properties already registered with a fair rent."

The agency declares:

"People will have more confidence in purchasing a property for investment purposes and they will achieve a better return on their investment."

The staff at the agency are now preparing for an upturn in the rentals market in 1989 as a result of the new law.
